The County must adopt strong new coke oven regulations to increase the pressure on the company to do so. #CleanAirNow

Fracking must not be allowed in areas where people reside, especially in our public parks. #ProtectOurParks #FrackFreeParks

We cannot allow polluters to pay to pollute. Our world-class universities have innovative approaches to measure pollution. Allegheny County uses outmoded techniques and inadequate fines. Allegheny County must adopt 21st Century monitoring and enforcement. #CleanAirNow

Shell's Plastics Plant opening in 2022 will pose an added threat to all of us. Surrounding that plant and other polluters with real-time air monitors is urgent. Urge our officials to install monitors at their homes, and let's join them by doing so ourselves. #CleanAirNow
